Charitable Care and Coverage

We believe everyone has a right to good health.

- **1,025 people** enrolled in our Charitable Health Coverage Program 
- **27,775 children** enrolled in Medicaid/Peachcare Program
- **18,319** received Medical Financial Assistance



Delivering Access to Care

We partner with organizations to bring free health screenings and resources directly to uninsured and underinsured adults in the community through our Mobile Health Vehicle (MHV).

Community Health Grants and Donations

Kaiser Permanente is committed to helping shape the future of health care.

- **Maternal and Child Health: Provided over \$2M** to organizations supporting pregnant mothers across Georgia. These funds provided support for doula services, breastfeeding support, perinatal resources, maternal health disparities research and much more
- **HIV/AIDS (Access to Care): \$297K** invested to connect people living with HIV/AIDS to medical care and supportive housing
- **Economic Opportunity: \$859K** invested to fund small business support, financial coaching, and connecting young adults, unemployed & underemployed individuals to equitable careers in healthcare
- **Food Access: \$460K** in support of food access and Food as Medicine programs across Georgia
- **Housing: \$908K** invested to support medical respite, permanent affordable housing to homeless and low-income families, unhoused veterans, and legal advocacy in substandard housing conditions
- **Safety Net: \$700K** to support the addition of Community Health Workers in our federally qualified health centers across the state along with support for chronic disease management for uninsured seeking care in free clinics
- **Rural Hospitals: \$600K** in donations to 10 hospitals in rural areas of Georgia to help increase access to care
